

### **Generous Conversations:** Family Discussion Starters

- In what specific ways could our family be more generous to one another?



### Generous Home: Bring Generosity home with these ideas!

- Each lesson in Generous Students begins with START WITH GRATITUDE. To get the day started off right, make it a habit on the drive to school to have everyone in the car share the three things they're grateful for.
- Students reflected on the truth that they are God's generous gift. Take a few moments to tell your child how he/she is a gift to you.
- Find ways to connect regular moments in the day to Generosity. The 7 Ways of Living Generously can anchor your parenting. It provides great language and understanding around building healthy relationships, managing conflict, maintaining harmony in the home, and raising kids with grateful hearts.



## **Generous Learning**A Glimpse Into the Adventure

- We completed an art project that represents how God's Generous Thoughts about us outnumber all the grains of sand.
- We reflected on the many thoughts that go through our minds and identified examples of how Generous Thoughts look different than Stinkin' Thinkin'.
- We shared kind thoughts with a loved one during our Thinking of You activity.



### **Generous Friends**

Meet **Ellie the Elephant!** She taught us about Generous Thoughts: Use a thought in my mind to think something kind.

Ask your child about our story — Ellie the Elephant and the Adventure of Stinkin' Thinkin'.



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### **Generous Conversations:** Family Discussion Starters

- Think of two kind thoughts about someone in our family, then share your thoughts out loud.
- Stinkin' Thinkin' happens when our thoughts are unkind, cranky, and believe the worst about someone else. When has this happened to you? How did it make you feel?
- Should we keep all of our thoughts inside of our minds or share our thoughts with others? Why?



### Generous Home: Bring Generosity home with these ideas!

- Set aside time as a family to affirm each other. Bedtime is a great time for this!
- Ask your child what Stinkin' Thinkin' means and remind them they can always come to you if they have sad or unhappy thoughts. It's never too early to teach kids how to identify unhelpful thoughts and redirect/rephrase them to be true and helpful.
- Be a model of Generous Thoughts for your child. As you observe opportunities to be generous and kind in the ways you approach situations or people, share your thoughts aloud so they can hear Generous Thoughts in action. Example: "The coach is 10 minutes late to practice, but let's be patient and remember that our coach works really hard to lead the team."



## **Generous Learning**A Glimpse Into the Adventure

- We felt feathers and sandpaper to compare how they are like gentle and rough words.
- We built a Generous Words tower with blocks and identified kind words that build up others, along with the power that unkind words have to tear down.
- We chose a favorite Generous Word or phrase we can use to build others up.



#### **Generous Friends**

### **Generous Conversations:** Family Discussion Starters

- What Generous Words have been said to you that made your day?
- What unkind words have been said to you that you still remember? This is a great opportunity to replace those with Generous Words about your child!
- Have you ever said unkind words to someone and quickly wished you didn't? How would you re-do that time using Generous Words?
- What are quick ways we can make someone's day in our family? Examples: Greet neighbors with a friendly "Hello!" or say "Good morning!" when we take a walk.



### **Generous Home:** Bring Generosity home with these ideas!

- Have a Generous Words Party: Turn on fun music, get out notecards and pens, and write Generous Words to family and friends. When you are done, address, stamp, and mail them.
- Create a Generous Word paper chain: When someone says Generous Words, write it on a strip of paper and create the first link in your paper chain by gluing the ends together. Watch your home fill up with color and Generous Words. You can celebrate as a family when it gets to a certain length or number of links.
- Before you arrive at gatherings with friends and family, discuss ways that you and your kids can use Generous Words with the people there. For example, plan to greet grandparents by name with a friendly, "Hi!" Or challenge your kids to ask someone a question.



### **Generous Wisdom**

#### **Generous Friends**

### **Generous Home:** Bring Generosity home with these ideas!

- Create new traditions, like Tipping Tuesday, where you and your family leave the server at dinner a bigger tip than normal.
- Designate a family piggy bank for extra change and money. Have it ready for when a new giving opportunity arises.
- Model Generosity by paying for someone else's coffee when you're with your kids. They will see how simple and easy it is to share.
- It's never too early to teach your child money management skills and the importance of Generosity. Consider incorporating opportunities for Generosity within the ways you manage allowance or at times when your child receives money.
- Face To Face Interview: Today your child completed a lesson about Generous Money. When time allows, please find time for them to complete their Face To Face interview. Your child will ask you two questions, then practice his/her active listening.



## **Generous Learning**A Glimpse Into the Adventure

### **Generous Conversations:** Family Discussion Starters

- What are some ways each of us can generously give our time to one another? Make a list and post it up for everyone to see as a reminder!
- Taking the time to be grateful and thankful is one of the best ways to be generous with our time. What is something specific you're thankful for today?
- What does someone in our family do that makes you feel loved?



### Generous Home: Bring Generosity home with these ideas!

- Being patient is one of the best ways a first grade student (and all of us) can be generous with time. Staying calm, kind, and able to tolerate delays takes practice and is a learned skill. When opportunities to practice patience arise, model this skill for your child and talk about the challenges that come with it.
- If you have some extra time or you arrive early somewhere, ask your child, "How can we be generous with this extra time?" Some ideas may include: a surprise video chat with a grandparent, cleaning out the car, praying together, or asking a specific person, "How can we help?"
- Challenge your kids to secret Generosity challenges with Generous Time, like smiling at people, offering help when they notice someone could use a hand, holding doors open for others, throwing trash away, etc. Building awareness of these small moments that have a big impact will have lifelong blessings for your child and those they serve!



### **Generous Wisdom**

John 9:4 — As long as it is day, we must do the works of Him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. It's so amazing how our minutes, seconds, and hours can be used to show God's love to others!
